BIKE SAFETY CLASSES (NOVEMBER 10-12)

Bike Fort Collins will come to our school and provide our students (Grades K-8) with bike safety lessons next week (Tuesday – Thursday). Each lesson will be for



about 45 minutes each day after lunch, one for Grades K-3 (Tuesday and Wednesday, 1:00 – 1:45 p.m.) and the other for Grades 6-8 (Tuesday – Thursday, 2:00 – 2:45 p.m.). On Thursday, the students in grades 6-8 will go on an off-campus ride in the neighborhood. The lessons include Walking & Rules of Road, Helmet Fit and ABC Quick Bike Check, and Bike Skills. If your children have their own bikes, please bring their bikes and helmets to school on Tuesday. They will bring extra bikes for the students who do not have their own bikes to use. They will bring a mechanic to fix and tune up their bikes on Tuesday as well. They can keep the bikes at school this week.

FCCS PRESCHOOL CORNER

The preschoolers were busy doing so many exciting things in the month of October! They have been practicing matching uppercase and lowercase letters, and have just started learning how to write letters and what sounds the letters make. In preschool, we begin learning to write ABCs with letter "L", instead of "A", because we teach letter writing based on the type of pencil stroke/s needed to form the letter. The straight lines in "L" are the simplest. "L" will be



followed by "F," "E," "H," and so on, until it is time to introduce the next set of pencil



strokes! To aid them in their study of letter "L," the preschoolers made a ladybug craft with a book that helped them practice identifying, writing, and making the sound of letter "L."

Preschool also worked on lots of fine motor skills in October. In the picture to the left, you can see some of the preschoolers practicing the fine motor skill of tearing and gluing paper. They used this orange construction paper to make a torn paper pumpkin art project! Tearing paper is an important fine motor skill, and is the precursor to good scissor cutting skills.
